

Pastor's Corner

September, 2017

Might I ask you a question? In my reading this summer the question was asked of me. Who is your teacher? Who do you look to for wisdom and insight and life giving truth? For many of us Jesus never comes into our minds when we think of who our teacher is. We look at him as our Savior, Lord and King but not as a teacher. Yet scripture says we are to be learning and growing to be more like Christ, that's the goal of discipleship. In fact the great commission says we are to learn to do all the things Jesus taught. How do you see Jesus? Have you ever thought Jesus was brilliant? Have you ever thought he is smart, well-informed, the master of all professions, jobs or studies? Often times as Christians we never even think of Jesus as having real life wisdom or experience. Can Jesus the Lord and not be smart? If he's divine and I know he is, can he be dumb? As the son of God would he be the most informed, smartest, most intelligent person ever? What would happen if we simply started to respect Him as such? What if we began to ask Him his view or idea for your job or marriage or life situation? Jesus how can I fix___? What if we believed He was our teacher with great ability? Look up Colossians 2:3; it says Jesus was and is the master of all wisdom and treasure. Just imagine if we began to honor him as our teacher! What if we became not just information gatherers, but learners? What if we obeyed and put into practice his teachings and lessons for life?

Sometimes I think we have forgotten being a believer is more than just being forgiven, it's being transformed. And the process of transformation takes time, study and effort. This transformation encompasses everything in life--our hearts, minds, bodies, souls, our work, our play and relationships. And it begins at salvation and continues to eternity. This week ask God to be your teacher and tell him you will be his student and learner and see what he will begin to do!



Daily Bread



For years, the dailyness of needs—my children's, my husband's, not to mention my own—left me in a state of chronic weariness. Tasks like laundry, cooking, dishes, and vacuuming certainly felt more revolving than completed. In fact, even my schedule seemed circular from sunrise to sunrise, often with interruptions throughout the night. One of my friends summarized young motherhood well: "I was pretty much just exhausted for about ten years."

But God never sleeps, because He never becomes weary. Might the prayers of millions around the world sound like the steady drone of midsummer insect wings to the ears of our Father? Yet He listens to our endless cacophony of requests and never covers His ears, never becomes weary!

Yesterday I needed grace and clarity trying to understand a difficult relationship. Today I need stamina because I didn't get enough sleep last night. Tomorrow I will need something else that God is already prepared amply to supply. There is great beauty in such a simple prayer, "Give me this day my daily bread"—because He knows the entire scroll of my day before it unfurls. He knows the holes I feel (or ignore) before I ask. He knows better what I need than I when I do finally make my request. Yet still, He says, "Ask me."

Because His mercies are new with every dawn, ask your Father who loves you to give you *your* daily bread. He bakes fresh loaves each morning, risen with the perfect blend of ingredients, specifically for your daily needs. And His bread is warm, ready, fresh out of the oven anytime we need it.



On June 19th I dropped my oldest daughter off at high school for the first time. There wasn't any fan fare or pictures, and my husband and I weren't "allowed" to walk her to the door. She gave us a quick kiss and jumped out of the car to catch up with some friends faster than we could say goodbye. It all happened so fast.

My eyes welled up with tears as I looked around and saw the groups of teens rushing up the front stairs. I turned to my husband and said, "Did you see the size of those boys?" I wondered if she'd feel overwhelmed or get lost in the halls. It seemed like just yesterday she was in 6th grade... Oh wait, she was!

Let me explain. Our school district has a wonderful tradition called "Move-up Day." On the last day of school, instead of going to the classroom you have been in all year, you report to your new class and meet your new teacher and classmates. For my daughter Ava, that also meant a new school since 7th and 8th graders are housed in the high school in our small town.

I said to my husband, "I am not ready for this."

After I dropped my other children off at their school I asked my husband, "Do you think that we have done enough to prepare her for this?" I wanted a comforting response but all he managed to say was "I don't know, I was wondering the same thing."

My greatest desire is that my daughter be equipped for what lies ahead of her this September. Over the next few months the scriptures I choose for us to memorize will include those that are specific to the situations she may encounter.

It's important for her to know what the Word of God says. Here are 7 Scriptures that will help your kids find confidence in the Lord anytime of the year, but especially during those back-to-school situations:

When she wishes she looked different...

I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. — Psalm 139:14

When the workload seems like too much...

He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint. — Isaiah 40:29-31

When she is not treated fairly by others...

But to you who are listening I say: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. — Luke 6:27-28




These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

What you need:

- 4 apples, cored and cut into 1/8" rings
- Large bowl
- Spoon
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- Baking sheets (sprayed)

What you do:

- 1. Place apple slices in the bowl. Add cinnamon and sugar. Stir so apples are coated evenly with the mixture.
- 2. Place apple slices on the sprayed baking sheets in a single layer.
- 3. Bake at 200 degrees for two to three hours, until chips are dry but still slightly soft.


