## Experiencing God's Love by Billy Graham

As I read the Bible, I find love to be the supreme and dominant attribute of God. Because of His holiness, God cannot condone or countenance sin, but He loves the sinner.

Because He is just, He cannot excuse sin. But since His love goes hand in hand with His justice, He has made provision to forgive sin through the atonement of His Son. "God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

The promises of God's love and forgiveness are as real, as sure, as positive as human words can make them.

But just as the total beauty of the ocean cannot be understood until it is seen, God's love cannot be understood until you experience it, until you actually possess it. No one can fully describe the wonders of God's love.

Some of our modern "experts" in theology have made attempts to rob God of His warmth, His personal affection for mankind and His sympathy for His creatures.

Never question God's great love, for it is as unchangeable as His holiness. Were it not for the love of God, none of us would ever have a chance in the future life. But God is love! And His love for us is everlasting!

Ours is the God of law who, loving the earth's people, and realizing that we had offended in every point, sent His only Son to redeem us to Himself and to instill the law of the Spirit of life within us. His eyes of

compassion have been following men and women as we have stumbled through history under the burden of our own wretchedness.

Jeremiah the prophet wrote, "The Lord has appeared of old to me, saying: 'Yes, I have loved you with an everlasting love; Therefore with lovingkindness I have drawn you'" (Jeremiah 31:3). Calvary should prove even to the most skeptical person that God is not blind to our plight, but that He was willing to suffer with us.

Compassion comes from two Latin words meaning "to suffer with." God's all-consuming love for mankind was best demonstrated at the cross, where His compassion was embodied in Jesus Christ. "God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself" (2 Corinthians 5:19).

Paul speaks of God as one "who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us" (Ephesians 2:4). It was the love of God that sent Jesus Christ to the cross.


But God's love did not begin at Calvary. Before the morning stars of the pre-Edenic world sang together, before the world was baptized with the first light, before the first blades of tender grass peeped out, God was love.

Turn back, if you will, to the unwritten pages of countless aeons and centuries before God spoke this present earth into existence, when the earth was "without form and void," and the deep, silent darkness of outer space formed a vast gulf between the brilliance of God's throne and the dark vacuum where our present solar system now is. *Continued on page 11*










### **Sour Grapes**







The Israelites were like this as well. When they arrived at the edge of the land God had promised them, twelve scouts were sent in to explore. They returned with fruit from the land and gave this negative report: In order to settle in the land that God was giving them they would have to defeat some very strong people and capture well-fortified cities. Ten of the scouts became so negative they stirred the people up

to the point that they were ready to stone the leaders. God had to step in and intervene.

One scout, Caleb, stood alone in his ability to see what God could do and spoke up about it. (Numbers 13:30) What was different about Caleb? What made him able to look at the same circumstances and assert, "We must go up and take possession of the land because we can *certainly* conquer it?" Why did he have faith when the others did not? Perhaps he remembered what God had done for them in the past. Maybe he was able to look beyond the obstacle and see the end result of stepping out in faith.

Caleb's positive example emboldened Joshua to also speak in favor of entering the land God had promised them. (Number 14:6-9) Don't underestimate the power of a positive expression of faith!

On the other hand, don't underestimate the consequences of unbelief. God struck down the ten scouts responsible for spreading the bad report about the land. Of the men who went to explore the land, only Caleb and Joshua were left alive. (Numbers 14:36-38)

God doesn't generally strike us dead for being negative nowadays, but I can attest that your life will be better and you will go much further if you remain positive and joyful in the face of trials. It's important to trust God even if it means standing alone in a crowd of negativity. As you walk forward in faith, knowing that you can certainly conquer whatever the obstacle with God's help, your life will be a witness to those around you. Instead of looking at the circumstances, wringing your hands and whining, look to God and move forward with faith.

Don't be a sour grape. Be the grape that brings sweetness to those around you.

### Getting to Know You-Dan & Shawneen Scharmer

As you know, God has brought Dan and Shawneen Scharmer to us as our worship leaders. We sat down for a chat about how God is moving in their lives.

## LZ: Could each of you talk about your childhood and upbringing and what made you the person you are today?

**Dan:** I had a "vanilla" upbringing. My family was a traditional New England family. We got up Sunday morning, got dressed, and went to church. (Congregational) But we were definitely the minority because Catholicism is really big up there. My friends went to CCD while I went on spiritual retreats. My mother instilled in me a strong sense of faith at a very early age. She and I shared Scriptures and prayed together.

What put it in higher spiritual gear was when I learned music. What first got me interested was my older sister playing guitar. I learned how to read music before I learned to read books. I played guitar for a while, but when I started playing trumpet was when my gifting took root. My first application with guitar was bringing it to church and playing along when I was a child. One of my first skills was transposing music to accompany the organ. I wrote the hymns out by hand so I could play them. Church music resonated with me. That was when I understood that God had gifted me.

One of the first spiritual lessons I learned was encouragement. I played so many wrong notes during worship. I was terrible. But people from the church would encourage me. "Keep trying Danny." The organist told me to just "play along." I would. I made mistakes and became better. Week after week church members instilled that sense of purpose in me. I played French horn in junior high and received awards and things for my music. At the same I was getting spiritual encouragement in church.

One of the other spiritual things that happened was when things went bad at our church my mother and I attended a Franciscan church. They were musical and encouraged me to bring my guitar to worship and play along with them. My parents still visit a Franciscan monastery every year for a musical festival.

That was my spiritual formation. My mother was my stronghold.

My calling to ministry didn't happen until later in life. During my college years I didn't do anything with church. I worked at a music store and another worker, Crystal, was always happy. I asked, "What is your problem?" She wore her faith on her sleeve. One day she said, "Sunday is friendship Sunday, why don't you and your wife and kids come." We did and got caught up in what God was doing. I wanted to be a pastor, so that year I applied to become a licensed pastor with the Church of the Brethren. Each experience that I've had has strengthened the pastoral part.

I like to look back and see how God took pockets of my life and used them and merged them. God put my management and music skills together in the cauldron. Crystal put in the faith part of it. Later I found my-self managing a music store and witnessing to people as I sold instruments.

**Shawneen:** I grew up in a devout Catholic family and began cantering when I was in sixth grade. I led the old school call and response in Latin. My nana was my source of strength growing up. She knelt, folded her hands, and prayed every night. She was the only person in my life that loved me unconditionally.

I always wanted to be an entertainer. I liked to make people happy and smile and sing at weddings and funerals. I liked to dance, too, but found out that singing touched more people. God blessed me with a voice that can change people's minds. Everyone around me knew I could sing. When I was in sixth grade my music teacher wanted me to try out for the musical Annie. I got the part.

I had a horrible upbringing-just about anything you could think of happened. Because of those experiences I've gotten to minister to other women who are going through those same things, letting them know about a God who loves you no matter what.

Dan and I met in our second year at the University of Massachusetts as music majors. I was a music performance/opera major and Dan was a music education and English literature major. I remember when we first went to Lancaster Church of the Brethren to a contemporary service. Dan was Congregational and by that point I had changed from Roman Catholicism. The congregation was clapping in church. I was having anxiety attacks. The next week we went to a traditional service but the Spirit wasn't moving. There was something special about the atmosphere in the other service. We decided we would put up with the clapping because we felt the presence of the Lord. We didn't know enough about the Holy Spirit to know it was Him. We just felt the overwhelming presence of God. We knew that was where God wanted us to be.

**Dan:** I met with group of men from church every week for Bible Study at a local pub. We had our Bibles on the table and witnessed to the waitress. That group of men went through the Bible together with a childlike wonder. We'd read a story from the Old Testament on our own and then come to group with amazement. Bible stories came to life, especially when we talked to each other about them. That was a great church. It was very encouraging. We supported each other through good and bad times. A deepening of faith happened at church.

**Shawneen:** We devoted a good chunk on our lives to that church. They were there for us when Dan had a seizure and went to the hospital. A cat scan showed the aneurism was gone and this gave us another opportunity to praise the Lord. Dan wrote a song for the church to let them know how they were part of the miracle.

**LZ:** Thanks to Dan and Shawneen for their time and willingness to share their God Stories with us. We'll talk more about their ministry, kids, and vision for GAC next time.

## Experiencing God's Love by Billy Graham

See God's dazzling, scintillating glory as cherubim and seraphim cover their faces with their wings in awe and reverence toward Him who is high and holy!

Yet, as lofty as the vaults of Heaven may be, and as pure as God's holiness glistens, there comes to our ears the word that the majesty of His love was moved for us, and the Lamb was slain from the foundation of the world.

It was love that enabled Jesus Christ to become poor, that we through His poverty might be made rich. It was love, divine love, that made Him endure the cross, despising its shame. It was love that made Him endure the contradicting accusations of sinners against Himself, that restrained Him when He was falsely accused of blasphemy and was led to Golgotha to die with common thieves.

It was nothing but love that kept Him from calling 12 legions of angels to come to His defense. It was love that caused Him, after every known torture devised by degenerate man had been heaped upon Him, to lift His voice and pray: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they do" (Luke 23:34).

From Genesis to Revelation, from Earth's greatest tragedy to Earth's greatest triumph, the dramatic story of men and women's lowest depths and God's highest heights can be couched in 25 beautiful words: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).

Many people misunderstand God's love. "God is love" does not mean that everything is sweet, beautiful and happy, and that God's love could not possibly allow punishment for sin.

God's holiness demands that all sin be punished, but God's love provided a plan of redemption and salvation for sinful men and women. God's love provided the cross of Jesus Christ by which we can have forgiveness and cleansing.

Who can describe or measure the love of God? The Bible is a revelation of the fact that God is love. When we preach justice, it is justice tempered with love. When we preach righteousness, it is righteousness founded on love.

When we preach atonement, it is atonement planned by love, provided by love, given by love, finished by love, necessitated because of love. When we preach the resurrection of Christ, we are preaching the miracle of love. When we preach the return of Christ, we are preaching the fulfillment of love.

No matter what sin you have committed, or how dirty, shameful or terrible it may be, God loves you. You may be at the very gate of hell itself. But God loves you with eternal love.

Because He is a holy God, our sins have separated us from Him. But thanks be to God; because of His love there is a way of salvation, a way back to Him through Jesus Christ, His Son.

This love of God is immeasurable, unmistakable and unending. It reaches to wherever a person is. But it can be rejected. God will not force Himself upon any person against his or her will.

You can hear a message about the love of God and say: "No, I will not have it," and God will let you go on without His love. But if you really want it, you must believe—you must receive the love of God, you must take it. You must be forgiven of your sins.

There must be a definite, positive act of commitment and surrender to the love of God. Nobody else can do it for you. You can sit all the days of your life under the preaching of the love of God and still die without Christ.

Or you can open your heart today and say: "Yes, I receive Christ."

Now, as in the first dawn of creation, God beckons you to fellowship with Him, and His heart yearns for companionship with those for whom His Son died. You, too, can join in this glad song of the redeemed. You, too, can sing:

"The dying thief rejoiced to see That fountain in his day, And there may I, though vile as he, Wash all my sins away."

Wash all my sins away." Respond to the love of God, and receive Jesus Christ as your Savior, Master and Lord. And become transformed by surrendering your life to Him.
