

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Pastor's Corner

Last month I had the honor of renewing my marriage vows with Joyce, we have been married over 31 years. Then this past week I had the honor of marrying a young couple in State College. So I've had some time to reflect and think about the vows we use to unite a couple. For some those vows are simply words, a part of getting married. Honestly, I've had some couples write their own vows but often they fall short, telling someone you love them is nice, but what does that really mean. After all we love ice cream, our dogs and that new truck we just picked up. In fact, I can still remember years ago when I was a certified EMT/firefighter and we came in after a call and as after the case everyone began to talk about life and times. One young firefighter began to trash talking his wife, it went on for a while when finally I asked him how he ended up married to her. (After all if she was so awful to be married to.) He stopped for a moment got this really sheepish look on his face and confessed he had asked her to be his wife. As you can imagine suddenly the conversation moved on to other things. This young firefighter had forgotten a lot of things, but let me cover just a couple.

First he forgot he was the one who asked this young lady to marry him. Sometimes we forget the reasons why we got married to begin with. Second he forgot his vows. Again simple to do in today's culture and world. For most people what we say and what we think are two different things. We think (never out loud) that a marriage is a contract where the other

person is pledging to meet all your needs. The other person will take care of everything, emotionally, physically, and spiritually. So when the ceremony ends all your needs will be met, let the celebration begin. Again we would rarely acknowledge this out loud, but it's where a lot of us find ourselves. And sometimes it lasts at least until the honeymoon is over. But let's look at those vows most of us said. Most often they begin with... Before God and these witnesses, will you take this person to be your husband or wife? Will you love and comfort, honor and keep in joy and sorrow (some will say for richer or poorer), in sickness and health. Will you preserve with this bond, holy and unbroken until the coming of the Lord or as long as you both shall live? Honestly in all the weddings I have had I have never had a couple stop and say really, that sounds awful hard. Nope we just move right through so the reception can begin. But what if we decided to review those vows on a regular basis? What if we realize those simple words were meant to be a covenant between God, the couple and the witnesses?

Those words call us to realize both of you are pledging to put the other first before your own needs. It's a reminder that marriage is a hard thing. Remember in sickness and health, for richer or poorer, in joy and sorrow, it's a bond you are in together. One day at a time, a long obedience in the same direction. What if every once and a while we would stop and talk about how things are going. Maybe ask some simple questions. What am I doing to fulfill the vows of my wedding? Am I putting my spouse before my own needs? Have we been noticing each other, encouraging one another, supporting one another? At the very least have we been treating each other the way we want to be treated? And just maybe do we need to remind ourselves we asked and agree with one another to enter into this marriage in the first place. I would assume everyone who reads this may not be a follower of Christ, but one of the resources we have is a Savior who really did and does witness at weddings. Besides doing some of the things recommended you can also ask God to step in and help. I know for a fact He will.

Lastly, I want you to know I'm hoping for another 31 years with Joyce. We've had ups and downs, experienced joy and loss. We've even been richer and poorer. It's been my everyday decision, that's been more than worth the time, effort and work.

Getting to Know You

This interview took place before Ray and Mary Ella Young moved in December.

Lora Zill is our new "Getting to Know You" reporter. Thanks Lora!

In a few weeks Ray and Mary Ella Young will be moving to Indiana to be nearer to their daughter, son-in-law and those adorable grandchildren. I sat down with them before worship team rehearsal one Wednesday night and asked them to reflect on their time here at GAC.

LZ: What brought you here 27 years ago?

Ray: We were looking around for a church and liked this one because of all the kids. We wanted ours to have those kind of kids to grow up with.

ME: We also like the music. At that time the church had special music every Sunday and a choir that sang every Sunday. I liked that. It showed a growing and serving church to have people committed to sing in the choir every Sunday and practice every week.

LZ: Talk to me about your involvement, where you've been and how you've grown.

ME: We were in a Sunday School class and attended church every Sunday. Eventually I joined the choir. At one point I taught Junior High Sunday School and also served on the governance board.

Ray: I started running the sound system and making upgrades. In the old sanctuary I replaced the mixer and ran a line from the front to the back so the choir director could step on a button and a little light would cue me to start the sound track. They also liked how I put in a reverb unit that could make the choir sound like they were in a big cathedral. Those were the old days of digital effects.

ME: We moved to the new sanctuary and lost our little button! I've had to turn around and do a little wave to have the music started.

Ray: After I made the upgrades here I started my own little business of upgrading church audio and video systems. I've done about 20 churches in the Greenville, Conneaut Lake, Transfer, Mercer, Sheakleyville, Meadville (Alliance Church) areas, plus at Thiel College's Passavant Center. A former GAC pastor moved to Pittsburgh and called me to upgrade his new church's sound system. I had to overcome my fear of heights!

Recently I did video work at Hillside Presbyterian in Greenville and climbed up into the old belfry. The old bell is still

there. The church members hadn't seen it, so I took a picture for them. I rang the bell too--it was really loud!

ME: I eventually began playing electronic woodwind with the first service. Ray played guitar or bass for second service. We've been on worship teams for 10-15 years.

ME: When we started coming here we had an organ and an organist and a piano and pianist. The pianist accompanied



the choir. Then the choir started using recorded music. When we moved to the new sanctuary we added drums and bass guitar and added .more guitars when we created two services. When we started here the pastor led the hymns, now of course the worship leaders do.

LZ: How did you (Mary Ella) become worship director?

ME: I went to Westminster College and studied music as an oboe major. Then I became assistant band director at Greenville H. S. and enjoyed it. I was directing the choir here. The church was just to the point where we needed somebody to organize and lead who could work with both styles of music. I've been worship leader for 3 years.

LZ: Any words of encouragement for the church?

ME: Come to church looking to focus on God, serving and glorifying Him. Be open to having the Holy Spirit lead and accept change even as Pastor Nathan said in his sermon, "Be teachable." There's no way you'll know everything.

Ray: I think for the church to move forward you can't live in the past. Be open to becoming more dynamic.

LZ: Where do you see God leading?

ME: We want to find a home church, get involved and see where he leads us. Hopefully I can still be involved with Freedom In Christ.

Ray: I'd like to find a church where I can be involved with stuff. That's where you get to make new friends.

Naomi and her husband Doug were privileged to serve the Lord in Colombia, South America for 32 years in church planting and discipleship. The last four years they have been mentoring pastors and leaders of the developing national church in Italy.

As the Christian and Missionary Alliance family looks back at 137 years of 'living the call together' around the world, we marvel at what God has done in and through us.

- In 1884, He led us to the Congo. Today, there are more than 2 million Alliance Christians in sub-Saharan Africa.
- In 1890, He called us to Israel, Jordan, Lebanon and Syria. Today the Alliance continues to spread throughout the Middle East and Central Asia.
- Seven years later, He led us to Argentina, Chile and Ecuador, where today the number of Alliance churches continues to grow in South America and Central America.
- In 1902, the Alliance set sail for the Philippines. Today, there are 3,000 Alliance churches, with new ones being planted almost weekly.
- In 1911, we entered Vietnam. Today there are more than 1 million Alliance Christians worshipping their Savior in that country.






Missions Corner....Love, God's Gift

KINDERCHURCH KIDMO

KINNECT

The ushers will now assist in ensuring that the kids who are dismissed in the service get to their appropriate classrooms. If you are comfortable having your child walk to kinderchurch, kidmo or kinnect without you, the ushers will take care of getting them to class. You must still pick up your kids at the end of church, as always. The ushers will NOT usher a fussing or crying child or a child who is hesitant to go to programming. We are hoping this allows parents to enjoy more of the service.

Please note change to Kinderchurch and Kidmo age delineation. Effective immediately, the age range for these two ministries is as follows:

Kinderchurch is for children age 3 through pre-k.

Kidmo is for children who are currently in kindergarten through 3rd grade.

5-year olds (or 6-year olds depending on where birthdays fall) will transition into Kidmo on move-up day in September after the start of Kindergarten.

Any 5-year old who is currently attending Kidmo but has not yet started kindergarten may stay in Kidmo.

Make this cute, healthy snack for your loved ones on Valentine's Day.




What you need:
